

Anti-social behaviour

Recently, youths were causing distress to residents in Acle by playing 'knock-and-run'. By conducting effective enquiries, the Beat Managers were able to quickly identify those involved and issue first-instance ASB letters.

At Lingwood Train Station, loud, disruptive, and intimidating behaviour was being displayed by a group of young people. Working with British Transport Police colleagues, the Beat Managers increased patrols and spoke to the suspects and their families, putting an end to the problem.

Thirdly, youths tried to start a fire next to a field in Reedham, which was extinguished quickly by a member of the public. The Beat Managers identified the youths involved through enquiries and collaborated with the Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service to educate them on the seriousness of their actions.

On all three occasions, fast action, collaboration with other agencies, and increased patrols in the affected locations meant the issues raised were solved and no more reports were made for these areas. This is a very positive results for the team.

Speeding

A speed sign competition was carried out with Acle primary school and the Parish council, where the children were asked to design new speed signs for the village. The winners have been selected and the Council are now in the process of having them made up and put up around the area to assist in speed awareness in the village.

The Beat Managers have also conducted speed checks at several locations over the last three months and worked closely with the Roads and Armed Policing Team to carry out joint speeding operations. Tickets and warnings have been issued to offenders within the area.
